Brian was born on June 10, 1938 in Manitowoc, Wisconsin. He died at age 74 on Tuesday, August 28, 2012 in Albuquerque. He died peacefully in his sleep. Brian was active and working and enjoying life on the day he died, as he had been on almost every day of his life. He is survived by his wife of 42 years, Pat; his daughter, Kim and husband, John; his sons, Braden and Gary; his two granddaughters, Katie and Melissa; and his grandson, Ryan. Brian received his BA degree from Northwestern University and continued with post-graduate work at the University of Chicago and the University of New Mexico.
