“ • James Robert Dziurzynski was my “little Brother.” He went by many names- some called him James, some called him Rob,, some even called him J.R. or “Ski.” His family called him Robert. • He was born on June 12, 1966, the youngest of four children, two boys and two girls. He was the cutest little blonde brother a sister could have and used to follow us around observing everything. • Ever since he was little he insisted that you look him straight in the eye when you talked to him. He would absolutely insist that you not multi-task; if you were talking to him, you were talking to him. He loved a good conversation. • Inspired by our father, Rob went to Spartan School of Aeronautics in Tulsa, OK. He loved planes, he loved flight. He became FAA Airframe and Powerplant licensed and certified and could fix anything, jets, planes, helicopters, any type of vehicle; he also was a master welder. He took Aviation seriously and often stated that he had exceedingly high standards because he always imagined that a loved one might be on one of the planes he repaired, so he always sought perfection on his watch, perhaps much to the chagrin of colleagues. • Co-workers and friends he worked with at United Airlines once asked me if I realized that Rob was an “Alchemist”; they said he could walk up to a plane place his hand on the metal and would just know what kind of repairs had to be done; he would then climb a ladder up to dizzying heights and begin healing the airplane. I asked Rob about this and he stated that it wasn’t as metaphysical as all that to him, all he did was look at the ‘injury’, calculate what it took to fix it, then calculated temperatures at 20,000 to 30,000 feet, and then meshed it all together in his head, then he would “heal” the plane. As modest as he was, he could do calculus and physics in his head and immediately translate this to the physical! He always toned down his very real exceptional capabilities. • Rob was working for an international airline repair center in northern California when 9/11 occurred. Few of you probably know this but he was absolutely convinced that at one time or another, he worked on every plane that was involved that day. This affected him deeply. To him it was personal; HIS aircraft had been taken down that day! • He was a very serious and deep guy. He contemplated the difficult questions

about life, love, death and spirituality. He fretted over the details. He appreciated, truly appreciated good food, good art, good friends and vehicles of any kind! He loved a finely crafted machine! Whether it was a plane, a train a Harley or an automobile!• Rob was an exacting individual with very particular tastes. For example, he was very particular about the way tea was brewed; the way carne adovada was prepared and the cut of meat that was used; and he could taste every single spice used in a recipe. And, as you may already know, he was an avid chocoholic, he LOVED chocolate! He was also annoyingly particular about service, customer service. He expected excellence from everyone around him, because that is what he expected from himself. Woe to any one that chose not to measure up. • Each one of you will no doubt have your own story. Rob had the uncanny ability to be the greasy guy with a wrench one day and a sophisticated tuxedoed gentleman the next; onion rings at one meal, filet minion at the next. • He ate with us, drank with us, critiqued us, argued with us, partied with us, made impossible demands on us – and loved us deeply all the while. • Rob was a budding craftsman and artist. He used his fine honed trade skills to create beautiful metal art and wood work. He had been brainstorming for quite some time about how to turn this talent into a career. • My brother was well-traveled and had visited Prague, Ireland, Italy, the Vatican, Holland, Austria, Spain and France to name a few places. He also had traveled all over the United States but no matter how much he appreciated these other places in the world, he absolutely loved New Mexico.
