James "Jim" Stueber, age 89, passed into glory on Friday, December 27, 2013. James was born in Marshfield, WI on February 3, 1924. He served in the United States Army during WWII with the OSS in North Africa and Italy. James is survived by his wife of 69 years, Marie; son Tom and his wife, Bonnie, daughter Patty and her husband, David; grandchildren Sean and wife, Vanessa, Tami and husband, Jeff, Seth and wife, Mary, Valarie, Kurt, Christopher, Kevin, Justin and Kyle; great-grandchildren Josh, Elisa, Garrett, Hayley, Mason, Olivia, Kevin James and Morgan, and dear family members Deborah Stueber and Charles and Carol Henson. James was preceded in death by his sons Richard and Gerald, grandson Scott and brother Robert. James retired from Sandia National Labs in 1979 after a career of 27 years. He enjoyed repairing tube type antique radios and played a major role in developing a 120-acre subdivision in Placitas. James believed strongly in prayer and knew that God was with him every day, and without Jesus he could not make it. He was a loving and devoted husband, who made sure their honeymoon never ended. “ Jim and I, over the last 15 years or so, had several overlapping areas of common interests that came up frequently as we discussed his latest attempt to coach me on repairing my antique radios. We were both born in Wisconsin and later on my own father was treated and survived a high risk surgery at the Marshfield teaching hospital in the same town where Jim was born.

Jim and my father both represented a common gentle approach to coaching younger men that seems to be uncommon in today's world of "Sound Bite" communication.

As a young man dad, like Jim, also built his own home-brew radios to the design of the "Radio-of-the Month" published in the magazines of the 1930's.

Dad, similar to Jim's experience, was jump-promoted by the Army to instruct on the equipment and then to maintain "computer-communications" of anti-aircraft guns.

Dad was also self-employed, where my mother shared the business side, having started his own Radio/TV repair shop after returning from the Pacific theater at the conclusion of WW-II. Dad then went on to design, patent, and manufacture the self-service tube tester found frequently in grocery stores and pharmacies starting in the 1950's.

Finally, Jim and I had a personal connection in contributing to National Security while employed at Sandia National Laboratories. I will deeply miss our quiet adult conversations back in his shop while Marie was entertained by the Shetland Sheepdog I frequently brought along during our visits.
