LeRoy C. Bowen, 74 of Albuquerque, passed away on Friday, June 19, 2015. He was born on February 20, 1941 to Chester J. and Mary (Turnbull) Bowen in Millville, NJ. 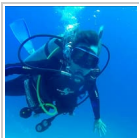
