Lilion L. Marksbury-Powell-Kline was born near Veedersburg, Indiana on October 20, 1914 and passed away Tuesday, June 24, 2014 in Albuquerque. The family came to Albuquerque when she was five. Lilion was a member of the Heights First Church of the Nazarene and held about every job there has been in the church at one time or another.
