Born February 1926, in Pennsylvania, Lisle W. Smock passed away Wednesday, December 3, 2014. He was preceded in death by his twin brother, Leslie, and his son, Ken. He is survived by his wife, Ruth; sisters, Lena Belle Moore and Rosemma Carrier and sister-in-law Grete Gaschler.
