Lloyd Merle Bellanger was born November 17, 1941 in White Earth, MN to Lois M. Bellanger. He entered the spirit world Tuesday, February 17, 2015 at the Lovelace Hospital, Albuquerque, NM. Lloyd attended grade school in Minneapolis, MN. Then he attended high school in Stephan, SD where he graduated. Lloyd lived in Los Angeles, CA for several years where he successfully worked as a building inspector. He then moved to Albuquerque, NM and enjoyed working for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, retiring on February 28, 2014.
