LANOUE, LOIS Lois Mae Honert Lanoue, 95, died April 9, 2013 at the Warm Beach Health Care Center in Stanwood, Washington with family by her side. Born May 31, 1917 in Carpentersville, Illinois she attended Zion United Church of Christ with her mother and grandmother.
