Marjorie Miller Harrington, of Albuquerque, NM, formerly of Delta, PA, passed away on June 26, 2015. She was 89. Born August 18th, 1925 in Whiteford, Maryland, she was the daughter of Delmar and Annie Mary (Norris) Miller and step daughter of Mary Elizabeth (Daughton) Miller. A 1944 graduate of Slate Ridge High School, she was a resident in Delta, PA until 2003 when she and her husband, Worley, moved to Albuquerque, NM to be closer to their son and family. Mrs. Harrington worked as a seamstress at the D & D Sewing Factory for many years and later helped her husband on the family dairy farm.

Marjorie lost her husband, Worley E. Harrington in 2013 after 67 years of marriage. They eloped on Dec 26, 1945 and were married at the home of the preacher. Mrs. Harrington is survived by her son, Gary E.
