She earned both a bachelor's and master's degree in Family Consumer Sciences Education from Eastern New Mexico University. Melissa met Jason Weber at a dorm party. A few short years later, Savannah arrived as a birthday gift on Melissa's birthday. This was just one thing they had in common. They enjoyed spending time together doing girl things, crafts, and

just sharing their thoughts and ideas. Melissa described Savannah as a sweet person with a sense of humor. She saw a little of herself in Savannah's love of fun and laughter! Both of Melissa's children share their mother's strength and courage! Melissa became a high school teacher in Albuquerque, NM. The majority of her teaching career was at Highland High school. As an educator, she went above and beyond the textbook always coming up with innovative ideas to inspire and teach her students. She taught eight years for APS dividing her time and energy between her students and family. The summers were dedicated totally to her family, and she enjoyed them with maximum energy and enthusiasm!
