Robert Eolide was born in the California Mission City of San Juan Bautista in 1929. Robert passed away peacefully, at the age of 84, on July 20, 2013 surrounded by his family. Robert started working at the age of 16 at the Ideal Cement Company in San Juan Bautista. Robert married Shirley Ann Lucchelli on June 22, 1958. He moved his family to Albuquerque in 1973 when he was transferred from California to continue his work at Ideal Cement Company where he was a Chemical Analyst. Robert retired in 1991 after 46 years working with the company. I will always remember our fishing trips: they would start with Grandpa gently waking me up with either cousin Val or Craig at the crack of dawn. Grandpa would have the cereal we picked out the night before ready to go, and he was usually just as excited to go fishing as we were. Grandpa would also have all the lunch meat out and start making our sandwiches. On the drive up, I would always remember Grandpa telling us he couldn't wait until we could drive so he wouldn't have to. When we would get to the stream, we would all pile out and get our gear together. Grandpa would always be the last one with his line in the water, he was always tying or baiting one of our hooks.



One trip I remember the most was when we were at Battleship, one of my favorite spots. I was standing on a rock with my line and hook in hand, jumped off of it and the barbed hook went right through my finger. One of Grandpa's good friends Noni and him, stood there in amazement as they both figured out what to do. I was freaking out, of course, because I was a little kid with a size 3 hook in my finger! They pulled out a pair of pliers and insisted they would have to push it through my finger, cut the barb and then pull it out that way. No way I was letting that happen so Grandpa drove around and found an emergency clinic open in Jemez. He stood there beside me the whole time while the Doctors shot and fixed me up. They ended up doing exactly what Grandpa and Noni wanted to do, but with local anesthesia.

He was also one of my biggest fans! Grandpa rarely, if ever, missed one of my baseball games, from the time I was hitting off the tee when he was telling the umpires to meet him in the parking lot because they were making bad calls, to my last game in high school still arguing balls, strikes and outs with the umpires. Grandpa used to pay the grand kids for getting A's and B's in school. Since I never really had the best grades, Grandpa bent the rules a little and paid

*me for getting base hits and pitching strikeouts.
These memories are still so vivid and seem like they we just a few yrs. ago, i will always remember you Grandpa and keep you close to my heart. Thank you for everything and always being there for me. Grandpa, I love you and you will be always be loved and missed by many.*
