Robert H. "Bob" Taylor, 69, a resident of Albuquerque, passed away on September 16, 2014. Bob was born on August 30, 1945 in Ardmore, OK to Haskell and Kathryn (Leech) Taylor. He attended school in Albuquerque and graduated from Highland High School and later attended UNM and graduated with a degree in business.
